Blessing of Graves



St Peter's and neighbouring parishes celebrate the 40th anniversary of Our Lady Queen of Peace Apparitions Thursday, 24th June 2021 at 6.00 pm – 8.00 pm, in St Peter's Chapel, Lurgan. Celebrant: Rev Fr Jozef Wozniak, S.Chr.

You are warmly invited to attend Holy Mass and a programme of evening prayer to mark this special 40th anniversary of Our Lady Queen of Peace apparitions in Medjugorje. 24th June is also the Solemnity of the Birth of St John the Baptist.

On the evening of 24th June 1981, a group of children in the remote Yugoslav village saw a bright light on a nearby hill. Following it, they found a beautiful young woman clothed in grey and white, holding a tiny baby in her arms. It was the beginning of the daily meetings with the Queen of Peace. She came, she said, as God's messenger. And the messages she brought were to change countless lives throughout the world. Our Lady Queen of Peace apparitions and messages continue today.
