WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY

This Day was established by Pope Paul VI in 1967 as an annual celebration that encourages us to reflect on the opportunities and challenges that modern means of social communication afford the Church to communicate the gospel message.

Make them seekers after truth and advocates of human dignity.

Grant discernment to all who rely on their labours and, as we confront the pain and promises of this world, awaken in us a sense of wonder at your presence and of longing for your peace. Amen.

REGINA CAELI

Pope Francis invites us with all Catholics around the world to make the month of May a marathon of rosaries for an end to the pandemic of Covid-19 and the resumption of work and social activities. There is an intention every day for people affected through the pandemic. Please do join your daily rosary for these as follows:

- 15 May for all migrants
 - 16 May for all victims of violence and human trafficking
 - 17 May for world leaders and heads of international organisations
 - 18 May for all doctors and nurses
 - 19 May for world peace and people at war
 - 20 May for pharmacists and all healthcare personnel
 - 21 May for all social workers
 - 22 May for all volunteers
- Every day the rosary is led by a different Marian shrine around the world. ***This Sunday the rosary will be led from Sydney, on Monday from Washington, and on Tuesday from Lourdes***, and you can watch the livestream every day at 5:00pm on www.vaticannews.va
