## WORLD DAY OF THE POOR

This initiative of Pope Francis stems from his emphasis on mercy. This year he draws our attention to the image of the outstretched hand. It is the hand of those who need help; it should also be the hand of we who can respond to their need and reach out to help.

## CORONAVIRUS

Face masks are mandatory for all attending church, including for funerals, weddings, baptisms and other special occasions. Attendance at weddings and funerals is limited to a maximum of 25 people.

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday remains suspended, therefore parishioners are encouraged to come along any other day of the week on a time and day that suit. Please maintain social distancing both inside and outside the church building. Kindly respect the advice and guidance given by stewards at all times.

As ever, those with vulnerable health conditions or **those displaying symptoms of Covid-19 should stay at home.**

If you test positive for Covid-19 and have attended an event in church in the recent past, please inform the parish office or sacristy by telephone. We encourage all parishioners with a smartphone to download the StopCovidNI app.

## NOVEMBER INDULGENCES FOR THE HOLY SOULS

We can greatly help the people in purgatory by offering an indulgence for them, by which God in his mercy forgives the sin—and remits the consequences of sin—which are the very reason anyone may necessarily spend time in purgatory before going to heaven.

The month of November is a special time when we can gain an indulgence for those who have died, and so help them to heaven. To prepare for an indulgence it is necessary to:

\* **go to confession**; and  
\* receive **Holy Communion**; and  
\* offer a **prayer of your choice** for the Pope's intentions.

Then an indulgence may be gained as follows:

a) On any day in the month of November, by **visiting a church or chapel** and praying one Our Father and the Apostles' Creed.

b) Once per day throughout the month of November, by **visiting a cemetery**, even in one's thoughts, and praying for the dead. Feel free to choose (a) or (b) or both.

By these prescribed ways, God's mercy is poured on those who need it most. Our communion with the Holy Souls means they will gratefully return prayers for you.

*This year Pope Francis has extended the period available when the indulgences may be gained to accommodate those who may be required to self-isolate or shield for a period of time on account of the Covid pandemic.*

In addition, some in our parish may have lost a loved one who lived elsewhere, outside Moyraverty; if you would like them to be included in this Mass please leave their names with the parish office as soon as possible.

**ST JOHN THE EVANGELISTS, LYLO**  
Weekly Mass will resume at 10:00am on Sundays in the chapel at Lylo, beginning on 22 November. As parishioners will expect, the small capacity of Lylo chapel is limited even further by social distancing, and now accommodates only **nine family groups**, or **twenty individuals** or a combination.

It is therefore necessary to book a place for Mass in Lylo by **phoning the parochial house (3834 1901)**. Inform us if you plan to attend by yourself or with a number of others, maximum five due to pew size. If there is no capacity for the date you desire, you will be offered another date on subsequent Sundays. **You should not attend with others from outside your household or bubble.** Please do not turn up at Lylo for Mass without having booked as you will not be admitted.
