## LENT: FASTING

Why do Christians fast? Why is it required of us?

1. To grow in self-mastery, i.e. the ability to say 'no' to our senses so as not to be slaves to *everything* my body desires. Jesus came to set us free, and we should be free to say 'no' to some legitimate pleasures (such as food) so as to be free to say 'no' to illegitimate pleasures of sin.
2. Obedience/discernment. My fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday recognises the authority of the Church to guide me towards holiness. Discernment means ultimately letting the Holy Spirit tell me what to do, what choices to make, and fasting trains us in obedience to the Spirit of God.
3. Worship/sacrifice. Fasting involves a sacrifice, and sacrifice is always oriented towards others, most of all God. Worship is to give of our possessions, our time, our hearts to God. We offer our very selves. "The heart of all worship is sacrifice." (Pope Benedict XVI) Therefore every moment of fasting becomes a moment of worship.
4. To be a co-redeemer with Jesus. Listen to St Paul: "In my body I am making up what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ for the sake of his body, the Church" Colossians 1:24). In fasting, or any suffering, we carry a little splinter of Jesus' cross, that he allows us to carry for him for the salvation of the world.

So, fast from any good thing: food, TV, social media, the snooze button...but do fast. (it's not just for Lent, you know ☺)

## UPDATE ON PUBLIC WORSHIP

The Northern Bishops endorse the **stay at home** message for the current lockdown. However following their meetings with the Stormont Executive and Public Health authorities, the Bishops and leaders of the other main Churches have identified 26 March as a *provisional* date for resuming the celebration of public worship, subject to confirmation after further meetings following Saint Patrick's Day. This gives us some increased hope that we will be able to celebrate Easter together, and dates beyond that for Confirmation and First Communion should be kept as planned.
