St John of Damascus (AD 676–749) teaches: "And now you ask, how the bread became Christ's body and the wine and water Christ's blood. And I say unto thee, 'The Holy Spirit is present and does those things which surpass reason and thought! "The body of Christ which is born of the holy Virgin is in truth body united with divinity; [while in the Eucharistic Christ], the bread itself and the wine are changed into God's body and blood.

But if you enquire how this happens, it is enough for you to learn that it was through the Holy Spirit, just as the Lord took on Himself flesh that subsisted in Him and was born of the holy Mother of God through the Spirit.

And we know nothing further, except that the Word of God is true and energises and is all-powerful."

HAPPY NEW [CHURCH] YEAR THE YEAR OF MATTHEW



The Church opens the new Church Year with the Saturday Vigil Mass of the First Sunday of Advent. The beginning of the new Church year this weekend immerses us in the Gospel of St. Matthew, which will be the "official Gospel" for the liturgical year of 2026. With a few exceptions, all the Sunday gospels for the next year will come from the Gospel of Matthew. So, what is Matthew's overall "message'?

Given that Jesus and his apostles were Jews, and that the earliest Christians understood themselves to be faithful Jews who worshipped in the Temple and celebrated Eucharist, St. Matthew felt compelled to compose a sweeping description of God's plan for the Jews-and ultimately for all humanity-in the light of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Consequently St. Matthew's story of the Christ is the fulfilment of the Old Testament in the life and death of Jesus of Nazareth. Almost a hundred times, Matthew mentions "according to the Scriptures" in his gospel, and he is careful to include a lot of Jesus' teaching which brings the teaching of the old Law to its completion. It's worthwhile reading Matthew's gospel for yourself, so as to get a feel for what he highlights about Jesus the Saviour in his telling of the Good News.
