DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

One of the first things the Lord Jesus did after rising from the dead was find his frightened apostles, wish them his peace, then breathe upon them, and say to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." His first command to them was to go and forgive sins, because he had suffered and died to take away those sins.

Now he is risen, he commissions his apostles to bring that forgiveness directly to everyone who seeks to be reconciled with each other and God. That is God's Divine Mercy in action. Pope St John Paul II fixed the feast of Divine Mercy on this Second Sunday of Easter in response to the request of Jesus to St Faustina: because forgiveness and reconciliation with God are the whole purpose of his passion and death. His Resurrection shows that eternal life follows forgiveness for us.

Divine Mercy is celebrated at every Mass this Sunday, and there will be an additional Mass to conclude the Divine Mercy Novena at 3:00pm on Sunday in St Paul's Lurgan. The Divine Mercy chaplet will be recited beforehand at 2:45pm.

To gain the plenary (full) indulgence available this Sunday, go to confession in the week before or after 16 April, pray the Our Father and the creed before the Blessed Sacrament in a church, pray for the Pope's intentions, and receive Holy Communion at Sunday Mass. JESUS, I TRUST IN YOU.


