EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

This week: Rosary and adoration in St Mary's on Wednesday 12 November at 7:30pm, concluding with Benediction at 8:15pm.

Pope St Leo the Great taught that the sacraments (Eucharist included) possess a divine power; they also come to us through Jesus, the one divine Mediator, and they are—and remain—connected to Him, the Saviour born in the flesh.

In this way the sacraments follow the logic of the incarnation, and so offer to human beings a way of Christ being present that reaches us, through that mind-blowing approach from God to us, from heaven to earth.

ST PATRICK'S RESTORATION WORKS

FEASTS OF THE WEEK

Mon 10 Nov Pope St Leo the Great, *pope
from 440–461, pastorally close to his people
while defending Rome, and taught clearly on
the two natures of Christ, human and divine.*

Tue 11 Nov St Martin of Tours, *bishop famed
for his kindness to the poor and spreading
the faith in 4th-c France. First saint not to be a
martyr. Patron of France.*

Wed 12 Nov St Josaphat, *monk turned
archbishop, worked for the unity of eastern
Churches with Rome. Martyred for the faith in
1623. Patron of Ukraine.*

Fri 14 Nov St Laurence O'Toole, *archbishop
of Dublin at the time of the Norman invasion,
noted for generosity and compassion to the
poor. Patron of Dublin.*

Sat 15 Nov St Albert the Great, *Dominican
bishop known for his study of the natural world
which points to God the Creator. Patron of
scientists.*

UNDERSTANDING OUR CHURCH BUILDINGS

As the Mass and gospel this Sunday draws
our attention to celebrating the dedication of
the cathedral of Rome, it gives us a chance to
consider our church buildings in general, and
their importance in our faith and worship.
For all Christians church buildings are sacred
places of prayer, but for us Catholics, the
words from Genesis remind us they are sacred
because of Who is within: *"This is none other
than the house of God; and this is the gate of
heaven"* (28:17). Our Catholic churches are
where God dwells among us, truly present in
the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle.
When we come through the doors of the
church, we are as close to heaven as we can
be on earth.

In another way of looking, the church
building is a special image of the Church (as
the people of God). The stone and timber
church building points to the living Church,
which is constituted by each one of the
baptised. From the earliest days of our faith,
St Peter in the New Testament was already
writing to his fellow Christians: *"Come to him
[Christ], to that living stone, rejected by men
but in God's sight chosen and precious; and like
living stones be yourselves built into a spiritual
house"* (1Pet 2:4–5). In this way of thinking,
Jesus Christ is the cornerstone, the apostles
are the foundation stones, and we are the
living stones built upon them, making up the
Church, and God dwells within us.

For this reason, we take great care in the
design, construction and maintenance of
sacred buildings that do honour and glory to
God and to the Church.
