REPAIR WORKS TO ST. PATRICK'S

Damp ingress through the basalt stone walls and window reveals has been an ongoing problem for the church and has caused major deterioration of the internal fabric. To address this problem the parish will carry out Phase 1 repair works in early 2023 to deal with the highest priority defects.

These works will include: repointing of the stone and brickwork with lime mortar, new rainwater goods, and improvements in drainage around the church. On the inside the plaster will be stripped to inspect the condition of the walls and timbers, and the decorative marble panelling will be protected during the works. To allow a period of drying out, the internal walls will be left as exposed masonry until Phase 2 works which will include re-plastering and decoration. Tender documents for the work are currently being prepared. Any contractors interested in obtaining the tender schedule when ready should contact the parish office now.

THE 'LAST RITES'

The Church doesn't have a ceremony called 'The Last Rites'. Instead, the term refers to three sacraments, often repeated through life, which are given for the last time to someone whose life appears to be nearing an end. The sacraments celebrated are Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist. By these sacraments, God forgives his daughter/son all their sins and absolves all the consequences of sin (the 'Apostolic Pardon'). In the anointing with oil God soothes and comforts the sick body and troubled mind, while in the Eucharist Jesus gives his own Body and Blood as food for the journey (viaticum) into the next life. These sacraments prepare us perfectly for going to meet God when life is over, and can also be given if the person is unconscious (except for the Eucharist, in which case Benediction with the Blessed Sacrament may be given instead). If you find yourself or a family member in this situation, or in the case of a sudden illness or accident, call a priest without delay (use the parochial house number). And may each of us have this opportunity of the loving ministrations of the Church when life nears its end.



CHRIST THE KING

The Kingdom of God is a space.

It exists in every home where parents and children love each other.
