EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

This week: Adoration in St Patrick's on Friday 17 January at 7:30pm, finishing with Benediction at 8:15pm.

St Hilary of Poitiers (circa AD 310-367), makes clear that Jesus' words in the famous 'Bread of Life' discourse of John 6 were given a very realistic interpretation in the 2nd century, the era immediately following the New Testament period: in the sacrament of the Eucharist (Holy Communion) we truly eat his flesh and drink his blood. His Real Presence is totally connected with the mystery of his Incarnation: the Christmas mystery. When the Son of God became human, he actually clothed himself in our flesh, uniting it to himself forever. In the sacrament of the Eucharist he actually gives us his own flesh, which he has united to his divinity. He is in us through his flesh and we are in him.

Christ himself bore witness to the reality of this unity when he said: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). We draw life from his flesh just as he draws life from the Father.

Next week: Rosary and adoration in St Mary's on Wednesday 22 January at 7:30pm, finishing with Benediction at 8:15pm.

GIFT FROM FR COLUM MURPHY

At the 6pm Mass in St Mary's Derrytrasna this weekend (11/12 January), Fr Colum will be back with us to celebrate the Sunday Mass, during which he will present a gift of a crucifix to St Mary's which he here describes:

To the people of Seagoe Parish,

This cross was made by my Grandfather, Matt Murphy, Rostrevor, around the 1940s. The figure of Christ was discarded from a convent that had closed and so to salvage it, as a carpenter, he made the cross and attached the figure to it so that it may be of use again. It was in his house for many years until he died in 1977, and it then passed to my aunt and was in her house in Omagh. A couple of years ago she then passed it on to me so that it might find a place of honour and may be used in some way that might remember him and glorify God.

With that in mind I wish to gift this Crucifix to Seagoe Parish, to be used as you might see fit, as an acknowledgment of the love, support and generosity shown to me in my time here as Curate in this Parish.

Wherever this may find a place and use then all I ask is that you remember my family in your prayers, and please know that this link, that we will share for many years, means that my family will also be praying for you all.

INDULGENCES IN THE JUBILEE YEAR 2025

"Now the time has come for a new Jubilee, when once more the Holy Door will be flung open to invite everyone to an intense experience of the love of God" (Pope Francis, Spes non confundit, 6).

One of the great graces of the Jubilee Year lies in the opportunity it presents us for starting afresh, for conversion and restoration of our relationship with God. God is his mercy wants to forgive our sins. The Jubilee Year provides us with opportunities to be free from the consequences of sin-past and present—which leave a mark on our lives. The Jubilee indulgence is offered to remove the punishments due to our having sinned and wounded our relationship with God. It is a way for us to begin afresh and restore our communion with God. We can also obtain the indulgence on behalf of the souls in purgatory. The first step in obtaining the Jubilee indulgence is a desire for repentance and conversion. We undertake to detach our lives from sin-even venial sins.

Secondly, as "pilgrims of hope" during this Holy Year, we undertake to receive devoutly the Sacrament of Penance and Holy Communion, and to pray for the Pope's intentions in one of the following ways:

1. By pilgrimage or visit to any sacred Jubilee site in Rome, or the Holy Land;

or to one of Ireland's National Pilgrimages at Knock, Lough Derg or Croagh Patrick;

or to a designated local Jubilee Church—the Cathedral of St Patrick and St Colman, Newry; St Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh; or St Peter's Church, Drogheda; or to a similarly designated Jubilee site in another diocese.

In each case we participate in the organised pilgrimage exercises, or make a "Jubilee visit", consisting of engaging in Eucharistic adoration, meditation and prayer, concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith (Creed) and invocations to Mary, the Mother of God.

Note: Those who, for reasons of sickness, age, vital work or other reasons, cannot make such a pilgrimage visit, may obtain the Jubilee indulgence by uniting from their homes and offering up their sufferings or hardships in spirit with the faithful taking part in person.

2. By works of mercy and penance

Visit someone in need or in difficulty (the sick, prisoners, lonely, elderly people, disabled people...)

Dedicate Friday fasting or abstinence.

Support the defence and protection of life in all its phases; the cause of abandoned children, young people in difficulty, the needy or lonely elderly people, or migrants; volunteer in the community; make a charitable donation for the poor. Participate in popular missions, spiritual exercises, or formation activities on the documents of the Second Vatican Council and the Catechism of the Catholic Church, held in a church or other suitable place.
