JUBILEE YEAR 2025:

'PILGRIMS IN HOPE'

An important aspect of the 2025 coincides with a significant date for all Christians, namely, the 1700th anniversary of the celebration of the first great Ecumenical Council, that of Nicaea in AD 325. It is worth noting that, from apostolic times, bishops have gathered on various occasions in order to discuss doctrinal questions and disciplinary matters. In the first centuries of Christianity, synods frequently took place in both East and West, showing the importance of ensuring the unity of God's People and the faithful proclamation of the Gospel. All baptised people, with their respective charisms and ministries, are responsible together for ensuring that many and numerous signs of hope bear witness to God's presence in the world.

The Council of Nicaea sought to preserve the Church's unity, which was seriously threatened by the denial of the full divinity of Jesus Christ and hence his consubstantiality with the Father. Some three hundred bishops took part, convoked at the behest of the Emperor Constantine: their first meeting took place in the Imperial Palace on 20 May 325. After various debates, by the grace of the Spirit they unanimously approved the Creed that we still recite each Sunday at the celebration of the Eucharist. The Council Fathers chose to begin that Creed by using for the first time the expression "We believe," as a sign that all the Churches were in communion and that all Christians professed the same faith.

The Council of Nicaea was a milestone in the Church's history. The celebration of its anniversary invites Christians to join in a hymn of praise and thanksgiving to the Blessed Trinity and in particular to Jesus Christ, the Son of God, "consubstantial with the Father," who revealed to us that mystery of love. At the same time, Nicaea represents a summons to all Churches and Ecclesial Communities to persevere on the path to visible unity and in to respond fully to the prayer of Jesus "that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world nay believe that you have sent me" (Jn 17:21).

EPIPHANY: **CHRIST IS MANIFEST**



The Epiphany Gospel (Matthew 2:1-12), in describing the Magi finding the child Jesus, includes the story of their encounter with the evil King Herod. This encounter demonstrates three reactions to Jesus' birth:

- a) Hatred: A group of people headed by Herod planned to destroy Jesus.
- b) Indifference: Another group, composed of priests and scribes, ignored Jesus.
- c) Adoration: The members of a third group—shepherds and the Magi adored Jesus and offered themselves to

Let us make sure that we belong to the third group, offering Jesus our worship, charting a better way for our lives away from what is evil, and becoming like the star, leading others to Jesus.

What is our gift to the Child Jesus? In truth, there is only one thing we can give that he really wants. Christina Rossetti captures it beautifully in her Christmas carol In the Bleak Midwinter. The final lyrics go as follows: "What can I give him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I could give a lamb. If I were a wise man, I could do my part. What can I give Him? Give Him my heart!"
